Original Content

TV, eh? features original reviews, interviews and commentary covering the latest in Canadian television. Respected television critic and TV, eh? Editor Greg David has extensive access to key players and talent in the Canadian television industry, resulting in coverage that provides an insider's perspective on the best and worst in Canadian television (and everything in between). Pieces from TV, eh? founder Diane Wild and numerous contributors offer fresh perspectives and round out the original content on the site.

Quick Facts and Figures



TV, eh? is a highly respected source for entertainment news. The editorial team has access to interviews, behind-the-scenes information and exclusive content for all Canadian shows.

TV, eh? attracts an average of **63,000 unique visitors per month** (since the site re-launched in August 2014).

TV, eh? sees an average of **81,000 page views per month.**

Over 500 readers subscribe to the daily TV, eh? e-mail newsletter.

TV, eh? is **Google News approved!** Google has recognized the site as a source for entertainment news in Canada, meaning it pops up in Google searches more often.

In the summer of 2014, through a crowdfunding campaign on Indiegogo, a total of **\$20,000** was raised to fund the relaunch of TV, eh? after a brief hiatus.

Donations exceeded the campaign's fundraising goal by **1,401%**.

The **210 contributors** to the TV, eh? Indiegogo campaign included conventional television networks; the Writers Guild of Canada and its members; actors; actresses; production companies; the Directors Guild of Canada and its members and the Canadian Film Centre, among others.

In addition to her role as founder and Publisher of TV, eh?, Diane Wild is an award-winning communications professional and freelance writer. Over the course of her 15-year career, Wild has worked as a writer and communications expert for a variety of organizations in the arts, health care and sports industries, including stints managing publications for the Olympic Broadcasting Service during the Sochi (2014), London (2012) and Vancouver (2010) games.

Wild launched TV, eh? in 2006 to shine a spotlight on homegrown shows that were often overshadowed by their American cousins. Since the site launched, Wild has interviewed actors, writers, producers, directors and scientists and helped to raise over \$10,000 for Kids Help Phone through a charity auction. Widely recognized as an expert on Canadian television, Wild has appeared on *The Current* (CBC Radio) and has been quoted in *The Globe and Mail* and *Maclean's* magazine. A past moderator of TV writing events for the Writers Guild of Canada, Wild also writes for *Canadian Screenwriter* magazine.
